## St John's New Curriculum

Back in July, whilst everyone was busy looking forward to the end of the school year, some of us had already been working very hard behind the scenes, making changes for when we came back to school in September. In this new academic year, we will be launching our new enquiry driven curriculum. Every half term, the whole school will explore there topics through and overarching 'BIG QUESTION', and all of our topics will be linked to these questions where possible. We are hoping that this style of enquiry will allow us, alongside the children, to model and demonstrate that not all questions can be answered; some questions have many answers, some questions we don't know the answer to (and that's ok) and that one answer isn't always correct and we may need to start again. Ultimately, we want to teach the children that it is ok to make mistakes and to learn how mistakes help us to improve. We have also made the decision to change our school week in order to give more time to our foundation subject.

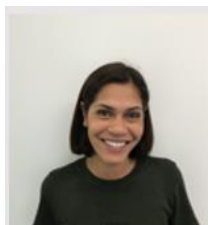
## New Faces
