Year 5

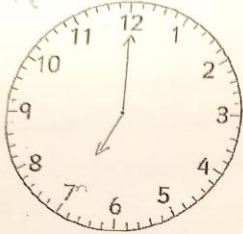
In Year 5 Maths, we have been learning about multiples and factors. Can you name all the factors of the number 56?

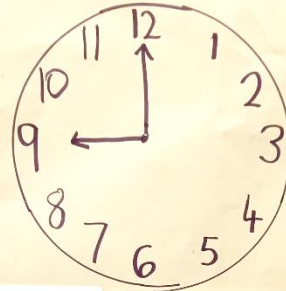
