We're really looking forward to all the fun of Numbers Day, and we really appreciate your support. All the money we raise will make an enormous difference to children today.


#### Reception

This week, Year 2 have been continuing their food technology project. We prepared the fruit and vegetables carefully and then followed the recipe, to make our delicious soup.









In Year 4, we have been looking at the features of a letter, and have had a go at ordering our own letter to show our understanding.







#### Year 5


