## Recent News

Last Friday there were so many wonderful things happening around the school. It was brilliant to see children in all year groups involved in so many brilliantly planned lessons and creatively engaging topics. Year 6 had an Indian themed day, all linked to their class text, *Keeping Corner*. There was cookery in the morning, which involved making Nann bread and Daal. In the afternoon, the children took part in a Bollywood dance class.



In **Year 5**, the children have been looking into natural disasters in their Geography lessons. Last week, they explored the layers of the earth, and what happened when the tectonic plates came together or moved apart. To recreate the effects of a volcano, the children created a mixture of a number of household ingredients, such as vinegar, washing liquid and bicarbonate soda, to create a chemical reaction and produce natural gases, which mimicked those of a volcano.



In **Year 4** this week, the children have been exploring electricity and circuits. They have been experimenting to see what components are needed in a circuit for it to work, and looking at objects that are conductors or insulators. The children made predictions and tested them to see if they were correct.
