Sally was passionate about encouraging children, particularly girls, to pursue interests in science, technology, engineering and maths. Sally wanted to use her fame to help promote equality and inclusion for all in STEM. This led her to start up a science company called Sally Ride Science. She created study programmes for girls and boys to inspire future careers in STEM. Since her death, the organisation has continued her work.
