


Reception


Year 1

Last week we started our work Design and Technology work on freestanding structures. To start this unit of work off, we had to understand what freestanding structures are so we went into the playground and explored making structures using a variety of materials. We then explored how to join materials together. This week we had our class assembly. The children were so confident with presenting all their learning. Well done Year 1 !!!



Year 2

Year 2 have been exploring fractions. We looked at the notation and found that the denominator tells us how many parts the whole amount has been split into. The numerator tells us how many of those parts to look at. Then we found fractions of shapes and quantities.




Year 3

This week in Year 3, we have started our 2-week swimming course; we were all very excited to get in the pool and are having lots and lots of fun! Every day we are going to Highbury Leisure Centre to learn how to swim confidently. We can't wait for next week to continue our learning.



Year 4

This week Year 4 have been learning about equivalent fractions. They made posters displaying their knowledge. They were very proud of them and we put them up in the classroom.



Year 5

Last Friday, the children had a cooking lesson in French. The children had to read the recipe and follow cooking instructions in French. They worked as a team to understand the recipe and followed the instructions perfectly. The children overcame the challenge by working effectively as a team and using their prior learning in French to understand the cooking instructions. Well done Year 5!



Year 6

One-way we improve our understanding of the characters and how or what influences them, is through drama. We also use this strategy to improve how we argue our viewpoint to persuade others. During our exploration of the character Jemmy Button (his real name is Orundellico and he is from Tierra del Fuego), we discussed whether he should go to England with Captain FitzRoy and his crew or stay on the island with his family and friends. We split the class into two rows; one row tried to convince Orundellico to stay, and the other, tried to convince him to go and expand his horizons. As he (Orun) walked along the 'conscience alley', pupils whispered their points and when the character reached the end of the line, they made their decision based on each side's arguments. It was not as easy as we thought it would be. Decisions, decisions. . .
