### Healthy Me — Emergency Aid

Year 5's PSHE lessons this half term have focused on the theme 'Healthy Me'. We discussed emergency aid and how to react in an emergency situation. They discovered trying to remain calm is the best solution to identify a strategy to help and seek emergency aid from the emergency services. The children also learnt about the recovery position and got to practice this with their talk partner in a practical task. They discovered the recovery position should only be used if the person is still breathing, unconscious and to seek emergency help as quickly as possible.
