Reception class have been designing their own superheroes using their initial letter. We then wrote about what powers they had using alliteration.

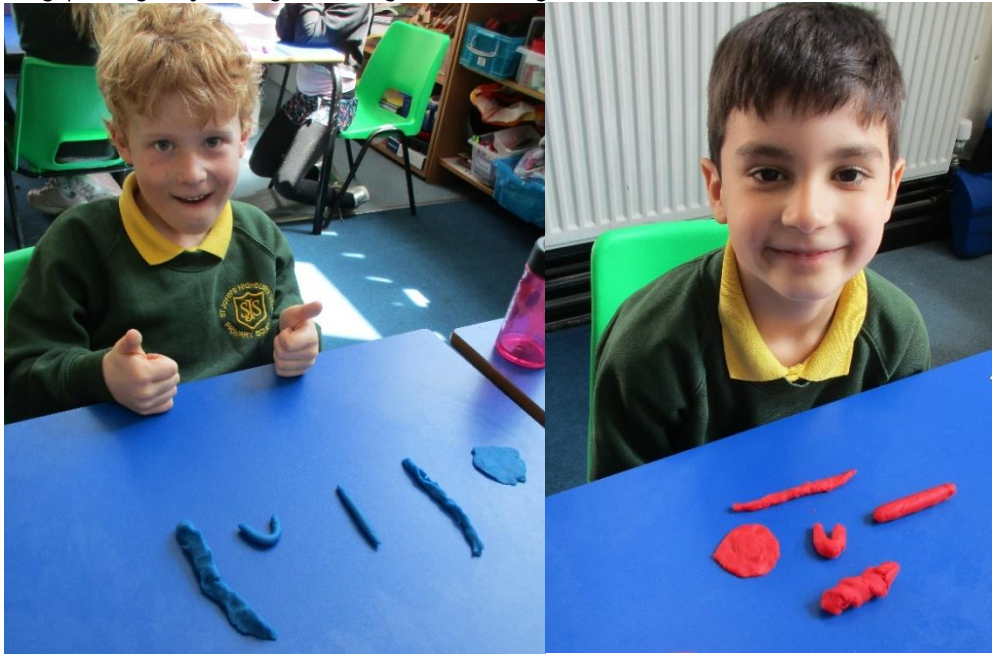
Year 1

In Year 2, we have been exploring everyday materials. We investigated how the shape of some solid objects could be changed by pulling, squeezing, twisting and rolling.



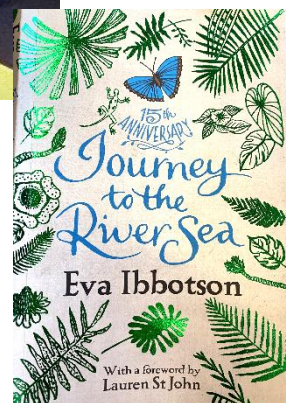
Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have been continuing our learning about the rainforest. We have been reading the poem For Forest by Grace Nichols and using it to help us imagine what the rainforest is like. On Thursday, we created a soundscape of the rainforest using instruments such as Cha Chas, Rain sticks and Monkey Drums as well as our voices. We used the soundscapes as a background for our own performance of the poem and we performed it to the class in groups. We had a great time coming up with our soundscapes!



Year 4

In English, Year 4 are reading *Journey to the River Sea* by Eva Ibbotson. In groups we made freeze frames to represent different parts of the story. Each group had to write a caption for their freeze frame to sum up what the characters felt at this point and to sum up what this moment meant to the character.



Year 5

Last week, the children got in the kitchen for a Science lesson involving cooking. The children explored reversible and irreversible change; discussing changing the states of matter. The children significantly enjoyed their scrumptious treats too. They made a Spanish omelette, chocolates and a Victoria sponge cake. Delicious!
