Reception class participated in National Poetry Day by sharing our favourite books and poems. We also created images to match the poem that we read in class.




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Year 1 News



This week, we have been doing Poetry in English. We have been working as a group to create our own Kenning Poems about Lions! We have used everyone's ideas to plan and write our own poems.










## Year 2 News
