


Assemlies are starting at 9.05am. All parents are welcomed to stay after the mornign drop off.





When we started filming, we realised how hard it is to make films; too many things to bear in mind from continuity to angles and acting. Ben and Tom skilfully edited our first rough cut. It was a great morning and we learnt a lot about how films are made.
