

Reception class have started looking at 'the colour monster' by Anna Llenas. We have been exploring emotion and how each emotion makes us feel.






#### Year 1

We got involved in various activities, such as; making candles out of hot wax, pottery, designing our own jewellery and creating rope. We also learnt how to fight like Saxons!

As part of our History focus, Year 6 were delighted to welcome Judy to show us some aspects of life during the Second World War. Judy shared her grandmother's book 'Cooking in War-Time' by Elizabeth Craig and offered us some sandwiches and cakes she had prepared following the recipes from the book. Year 6 found some of the food rather delicious, despite not containing any eggs or butter. Year 6 also planned a 'War time' birthday party for Willie, one of the main characters from Good Night Mister Tom, our class novel.
