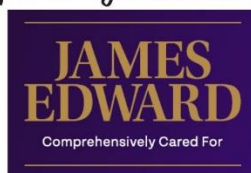

Understanding your emotions helps to self-regulate yourself better, navigate your way through tough situations and handle in a calmer, purposeful way.

Taking control of your life

It does not mean you control everything that happens. It means that you understand what you can control, what you can't control and focus on what you can do by confidently moving forward with your own goals and priorities, while embracing change as an inevitable part of life.

'If you find you are here and now intolerable and it makes you unhappy, you have three options: remove yourself from the situation, change it, or accept it totally. If you want to take responsibility for your life, you must choose one of those three options, and you must choose now.' *Eckhart Tolle*

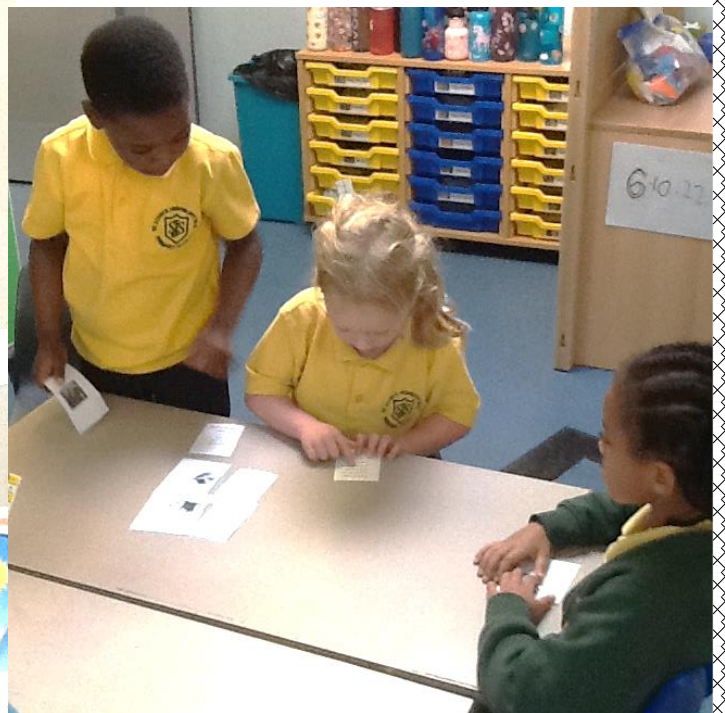
Reception

Year 1

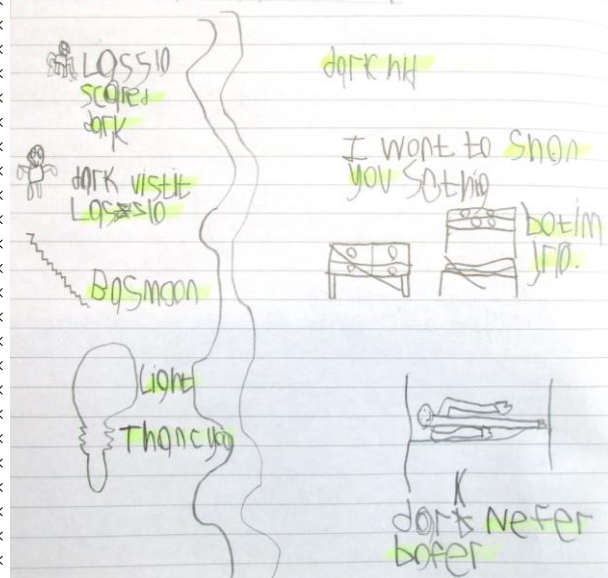
In Year 1 we have been looking at the poem 'Beware!' by James Carter and played a matching game for different poems in small groups.



Year 2

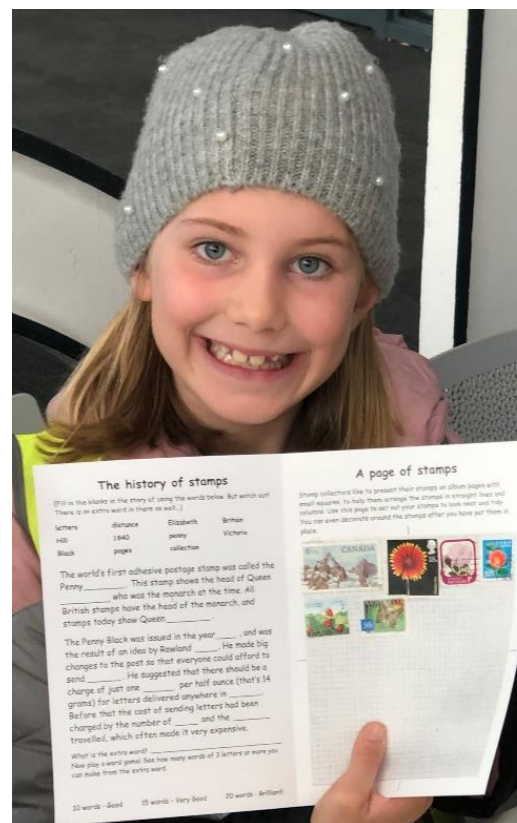
This week in Year 2, we have been sequencing events and drawing story maps for our class text: The Dark.
