


### Reception

Reception class have been looking at the creation story and using mixed media re-created our favourite part.



#### Year 1

At end of last half term, Year I en joyed a workshop all about seasons (Geography). The children learned how the weather changes with each season. They began to explain why they would wear different clothes at different times of the year and talked about what they might wear if they lived in a very hot or cold place.



## Year 2


In Year 2, we have been exploring the traditional tale, Rapunzel. We worked in groups to act out the story.





### Year 3

This week Year 3 have been investigating measurement in maths. We started by looking at mm, cm and m and how we can measure them and convert between them. Then we looked at the perimeter of shapes. We used pieces of string to measure different things we use in the classroom and learned a lot before measuring the perimeter of 2D shapes.



### Year 4

The Year 4's loved taking part in the Diwali workshop. We learnt about the story of Rama, his wife Sita and the defeat of the demon king Ravana. We danced to tell the story and moved our bodies in fun ways.



## Year 5

Last half term, Year 5 went on their first school trip of the academic year to the British Museum. They got to explore 'Ancient Greece' in greater detail through the museums exhibitions and a thought provoking 'Greek Myths' lecture about Greek pots.



### Year 6

Year 6 have been learning about biographies. We researched facts about the famous poet, musician and actor Benjamin Zephaniah. We used our notes to create an oral biography before we start to write one next week.
