




The Foundation Stage Curriculum

We work to support your child in all aspects of their growth and development




How we Learn

A balance of child initiated and adult directed learning through play and exploration

In Reception at St John's, we encourage children to learn through modelling ideas and encouraging them to have a go themselves. For this reason we provide a balance of teacher-led learning sessions and opportunity for independent play.
















Phonics

Read, Write, Inc

Children are taught the sound alongside a picture. Pictures help children to remember the sounds they are taught and learn how to write them.

How you can help your child – Independence!

You can help your child settle into school in September, by starting their learning now

Teach your child to look after their property and treat the property of others with respect

Cook with your child, and encourage them to talk about the changes that occur

Teach your child to write their name, using lower case letters, to count and to write numerals to 10 Talk to your child in your home language, and try to use a rich and varied vocabulary

Allow your child to be independent in feeding themselves, dressing themselves and going to the toilet on their own

Encourage your child to draw, colour and be imaginative. Then share with others and communicate with them

Complete jigsaws, puzzles and play number games with your child and encourage them to talk about numbers that they know

Read with your child and take them to the library to encourage their interest in books and stories



Attendance

It is important that your child is at school on time every day. Missing school means that they are missing valuable learning, and regular absence will mean that your child does not learn the skills that they will need to succeed as they progress through the school.

Make sure that your child is on time for school to avoid missing the start of the learning session

If you need to take your child out of school, then you will need to request this using an official request form

How can you help us to help your child?

If your child is unwell, ring the school office or use the school app to let us know

If your child has an appointment, then please try and bring them back into school afterwards

What to get and where to get it

It is important that your child is dressed smartly at school, so that they learn to feel proud of themselves and their learning. At St John's we wear:



- A Green St John's jumper or cardigan
- A Yellow polo shirt
- Grey trousers, skirt, or pinafore
- Green summer dresses
- Black or grey tights, or socks
- Smart black shoes / trainers

School Lunches

As part of Islington's school support every child receives a free school lunch, which is very rare across the country.

To receive this free meal every child needs complete the online form to ensure Islington and the school receive the correct funding for the academic year.

The school lunches are provided by Caterlink and are prepared on site, fresh on a daily basis. In Autumn term all parents will be invited in to see the school lunches process and share the experience with their child.

Arrangements for September

The introduction for pupils to STJHV is very important and a key aspect that we pride ourselves in doing.

- Home visits
- Nursery visits
- If your child has medical needs. They will need to bring in their epi-pen asthma pump etc into school on their 1st day and you will need to fill out a medical form.
- Pupils will start on a part time basis and after 5 days will transition to full time.
 - Half day is 9am 12.30pm
- Lunch will be provided everyday, even on part time days
- Children will come into school via the main playground entrance on Conewood Street.
 - On half days, children will be collected from Maberly Hall.
 - Once they are full time they will be collected from the playground area of the classroom.
