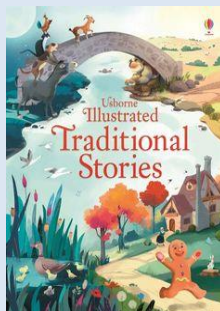


## English:

## Maths:

We will focus on addition and subtraction, place value and measurement and will be developing the following skills;

- Number bonds and related subtraction facts.
- Adding and subtracting one-digit and two-digit numbers.
- Solving problems.
- Counting forwards and backwards to and from 50.
- Counting, reading and writing numbers to 50 in numerals and words.
- Counting in multiples of twos, fives and tens.

## Science:

This half term we will be continuing our topic of Seasonal Changes and we will be:

- Observing changes across the 4 seasons.
- Observing and describing weather associated with the seasons.
- Observing how the day length varies across the 4 seasons.

## History & Geography:

Our Topic this half term is Visiting the U.K.

The children will use world maps, atlases and globes to name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.

We will also use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port and harbour.
