

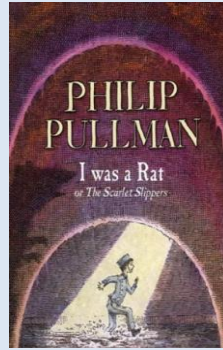
English:

Writing: Our focus text for this term will be 'I was a Rat or The Scarlet Slippers' written by Phillip Pullman. This will cover elements of writing in role, diary writing, persuasive writing, letter writing and newspaper writing. We will use these lessons to teach various grammar techniques that the children should be using in their writing.

Reading: This term our reading lessons will be focused on Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens to ensure that the children are exposed to key classic texts.

SMSC Links: sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them.

Maths: Maths:

Place Value: We will be securing children's understanding of place value up to 4-digit numbers. This will also include partitioning, rounding, roman numerals and negative numbers.

Addition and subtraction: Children will revisit formal written methods for addition and subtraction up to 4 digit numbers.

Times tables: Tests will be every Thursday afternoon, each child will have specific times tables they will be tested on.

This Term's Christian value is '**Friendship**'

Weekly homework tasks are given out on Friday and collected on Wednesday.

Religious Education:

We will be looking to answer the question 'How did the belief in God effect the actions of people in the old testament?' We will be learning about stories from the Old Testament and how they have impact on Christians today. We also think about the difference faith makes to believer's lives' and how this affects how they make their decisions.

SMSC Links: exploring, improving understanding of and showing respect for different faiths and cultural diversity.

PHSE: This term we children will be learning about 'being me in my world'. We will be focusing on being a good friend and the characteristics we would expect to see in good teamwork. We will learn how our actions can affect our self and others around us. We will also explore rights, responsibilities, democracy and how they have a voice in the school and wider community.

SMSC Links: understanding of the consequences of their behaviour and actions.

History & Geography:

Our topic for this term is The Anglo-Saxons. Children will revisit the Anglo-Saxon period of history at greater depth. This will include the invasion and settlement, Anglo-Saxon writing, Gods and various aspects of Anglo-Saxon life.

SMSC Links: appreciation of the wide range of cultural influences that have shaped their own heritage and that of others.

Science:

The children will be learning about Animals, Including Humans. They will learn about the human digestive system, teeth and food chains.

SMSC Links: enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them.

French: The children will learn to speak about different types of transportation in French.

Physical Education:

This term on a Tuesday children will be exploring movement and travel through dance. Children will also be learning hockey on a Thursday.

SMSC Links: willingness to participate in and respond positively to sporting opportunities.

PE Kit Required on: Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure your child has a full P.E kit.

Art/Design: We will be making connections to Oliver Twist in our art lessons this term. We will be looking at the Victorian artist William Morris. We will also look at key inventors from this period of history and become inventors ourselves. **SMSC Links: Engagement in and developing an appreciation for artistic opportunities.**

Computing:

This term children will explore coding. Children will review coding vocabulary, create a flowchart design to control programs and program a character to respond to user keyboard input.

SMSC Links: use of imagination and creativity in their learning.

Music: Children will be learning to play the recorder in weekly lessons on a Tuesday afternoon. If children would like their own recorder these can be purchased at the office.
