<p align="center"><b><u>Reading</u></b></p> <p>Reading is a skill for life and a tool that will allow every child to develop as a learner.</p> <p>Every Monday and Friday your child will receive a reading challenge, which they need to complete. This is child specific to support their own pace.</p> <p>Please complete the reading records to support the school in understanding your child's progress. We ask for one entry a week to be from an adult at home.</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Writing</u></b></p> <p>This term writing homework will be focused on newspaper articles.</p> <p>Your child needs to keep a scrapbook with 4 newspaper cuttings of their choice and write a paragraph with a short summary and their opinion on the article.</p> <p>Parents will need to supervise reading material. There are some great children's publications out there such as First News and The Week; these might be a good choice for age appropriate news.</p>	<p align="center"><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p align="center">15 in 15</p> <p>Every Friday your child will receive 15 calculation sums that are linked to Year 6 expectations. These need to be completed and returned by Wednesday.</p> <p>They will also receive 1 problem solving question to extend their learning.</p> <p>This task should take no longer than 30 minutes.</p>
