Rights and Respecting award

What are Rights and Respecting schools?

"Rights Respecting School Award" (RRSA), is a program developed by UNICEF UK that aims to embed children's rights into a school's ethos and culture. By participating, schools commit to promoting respect, dignity, and equality within their community. This award is rooted in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and encourages schools to make children aware of their rights and to practise respecting others' rights.

The award has different levels, usually starting with a "Recognition of Commitment" and progressing through "Bronze," "Silver," and "Gold" stages, each indicating a deeper integration of the principles of children's rights and respect within school practices and policies.

I am so pleased to say that this week we have been awarded **silver**. To achieve this award we (the staff and children) have demonstrated that our school is based on mutual respect, inclusion, and understanding. Pupils feel valued and safe, leading to a more harmonious school atmosphere.
