Sickness

At our school the health and well-being of our children and staff are a top priority. We would like to remind all parents of the **48-hour rule** when a child has experienced **diarrhoea or vomiting**.

Why is the 48-Hour Rule Important?

If your child has had diarrhoea or vomiting, they must stay at home for **48 hours after their last episode** before returning to school. This is in line with NHS and Public Health England guidance and helps to:

- **Prevent the spread of illness** Stomach bugs can be highly contagious, and keeping children home reduces the risk of spreading infections to others.
- **Allow your child time to recover** Even if they seem better, their body needs time to fully recover and regain strength.
- **Protect other children and staff** Keeping unwell children at home helps us maintain a safe and healthy environment for everyone.

We understand that this may sometimes be inconvenient, but following this guidance helps protect the wider school community. If your child becomes unwell at school, we will contact you to collect them as soon as possible.
